# Vision


To help eradicate curable blindness by providing in low-income geographies affordable, accessible, sustainable, quality curative and preventive eye care services and empower women to achieve this.

# Inaugurating Bihar's First Specialised Paediatric Eye Care Unit

It is estimated that over 456,000 children in Bihar suffer from refractive errors.

In addition, an estimated 50,000 children suffer from blindness due to cataract from birth, which can be cured. In our commitment to take eye care services to areas of need and reach the children of Bihar, in April 2019, with support from Orbis International, we launched Bihar's first Children's Eye Centre at Mastichak. Mr. Bob Ranck, President & CEO, Orbis International inaugurated our newly renovated paediatric unit.



Not only will it address the unmet need for quality child eye care services in the region but also help us inch towards seeing a nation where no child is needlessly blind or visually impaired.



We are answering the prayers of millions of parents and helping the children of Bihar look towards a brighter future.

Samastipur – 40 bed hospital during the first phase Purnea – 40 bed hospital during the first phase



The 40 bed hospital at Purnea with support from The Savitri Waney Charitable Foundation will further help us reach out to the people of the four districts of Purnea, Madhepura, Supaul and Araria.



Both these hospital locations have been strategically chosen to widen our reach in Bihar.



## Inauguration Of In-house Spectacle Manufacturing Unit

It is estimated that 19 million people in Bihar need spectacles but do not wear one. Akhand Jyoti is on a mission to correct their vision by providing them with affordable eyewear.



In February 2019 an in-house spectacle manufacturing unit was inaugurated at the Akhand Jyoti Eye Hospital's tertiary centre at Mastichak, Bihar.
Mr. Jayesh Parekh, Member, Advisory Board, Akhand Jyoti inaugurated the unit.



The addition of this state-of-the-art unit enables us to manufacture spectacle lenses at a much lower cost than the market price. It further helps us deliver spectacles to patients on the very same day of his visit and examination at the centre.



## Fundraising Campaign In Singapore

Akhand Jyoti organised its 1st overseas fundraising campaign in collaboration with BridgeAble Pte. Ltd. at Singapore from 2nd to 11th of March 2019. Mritunjay Tiwary, Executive Trustee and Founder, Akhand Jyoti, along with his team motivated not only the Indian diaspora but also Singaporeans of other origin to come forward and donate to the cause.




## Making Of Films



## School Screening Programme

It is estimated that 50,000 children are blind from birth due to cataract and this can be cured. Further an estimated 456,000 suffer from refractive errors, which hinder their holistic development.



Akhand Jyoti with support from Orbis International and Essilor is on a mission to provide primary screening to school going childrens, spectacles to correct their vision, and sight restoring surgeries, all for free.




More than 100 patients attended the camp and were advised by our panel of doctors, specialised in Glaucoma.




